\* An eligible caregiver is:

1. An adult family member or another individual, i.e. friend or neighbor, who is an informal provider of in-home and community care to:
  - an individual age 60 or older; or
  - an individual, regardless of age, with Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder with neurological and organic brain dysfunction.
2. An older relative caregiver (55+) (parent, grandparent, or another relative by blood, marriage or adoption) who lives with and is the primary caregiver for:
  - an individual with a disability\*, age 19-59; or
  - a child under the age of 18 (cannot be the parent).
